Communications from the Mayor and Council

Mayor Eccles, and Councillors Hergert, Cutting, and Hutchinson, reported on past activities and events since the last regular meeting of Council, and on upcoming events and activities.

Delegations

Jamie Doherty, Business Community Counsellor, Saugeen Economic Development Corporation

Jamie Doherty, Business Community Counsellor, Saugeen Economic Development Corporation, and Darlene Boisvenue, Project Coordinator for The Hawks' Nest, gave a powerpoint presentation requesting Council consider being a sponsor for the proposed Hawk’s Nest event scheduled for June 13, 2018 at the Knights of Columbus Hall between Walkerton and Hanover, in partnership

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with the Saugeen Economic Development Corporation (SEDC) and the Bruce Community Futures Development Corporation (Bruce CFDC).

There will be 7 finalists, with six Hawks, and a minimum of \$30,000 to be invested, There are a number of sponsorship opportunities available, as the Hawk's Nest event is being solely funded through sponsorships. The event is expected to have approximately 400 in attendance.

Council questioned what the sponsorship money is used for. Ms. Boisvenue indicated sponsorship funds pay for the facilities and ancillary costs, as the \$30,000 is paid by the 6 Hawks (\$5,000 each). – resolution #135-18

**Hergert-Thompson, WHEREAS municipal governments in Ontario do not have the right to approve landfill projects in their communities, but have authority for making decisions on all other types of development;
AND WHEREAS this outdated policy allows private landfill operators to**

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consult with local residents and municipal Councils, but essentially ignore them;

AND WHEREAS municipalities already have exclusive rights for approving casinos and nuclear waste facilities within their communities, **AND FURTHER** that the province has recognized the value of municipal approval for the siting of power generation facilities;

AND WHEREAS the recent report from Ontario's Environmental Commissioner has found that Ontario has a garbage problem, particularly from industrial, Commercial and Institutional (ICI) waste generated within the City of Toronto, where diversion rates are as low as 15 percent.

AND WHEREAS municipalities across Ontario are quietly identified and targeted as potential landfill sites;

AND WHEREAS municipalities should be considered experts in waste management, as they are responsible for this within their own communities, and often have decades' worth of in-house expertise in managing waste, recycling, and diversion programs;

AND WHEREAS municipalities should have the right to approve or reject these projects, and assess whether the potential economic benefits are of sufficient value to offset any negative impacts and environmental concerns;

THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Municipality of West Grey supports Bill 16, Respecting Municipal Authority Over Landfilling Sites Act introduced by MPP Ernie Hardeman and calls upon the Government of Ontario, and all political parties, to formally grant municipalities the authority to approve landfill projects in or adjacent to their communities;

AND FURTHER THAT Council directs the Clerk to send a supporting letter with a copy of this resolution to Ernie Hardeman, MPP, AMO, Minister of the Environment and Climate Change, Premier of Ontario, and local MPPs.

Question Period

Dorothea Eppler mentioned the need to reduce the amount of garbage by taking more responsibility for recycling materials that can be recycled that are still going into the garbage. Education is a key component to encourage individuals to

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recycle, and asked if the Municipality is willing to enhance educating the public to encourage recycling and reducing waste overall. Ms. Eppler indicated she does not support incineration as it will release toxic materials into the atmosphere. Mayor Eccles indicated the Municipality will be encouraging recycling through educational means as part of the overall strategy for recycling and waste management.

Marian Ratcliffe also noted we need manufacturers to reduce their packaging and better use of recycling materials for their products. Ms. Ratcliffe asked where is the recycling going, such as China. Mayor Eccles has indicated there is no longer a market for some materials such as Styrofoam and bale wrap, so it is a problem. Municipal organizations are trying to address these issues. Ms. Ratcliffe emphasized the need to reduce waste and recycling by using re-usable products, for instance.

Council requested the Waste Diversion Ontario website be included in the next tax newsletter to provide an educational resource for ratepayers to determine proper recycling methods.
