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Part II - Regular Agenda

Communications from the Mayor and Council

Mayor Eccles, and Councillors Lawrence, and Hutchinson, reported on past activities and events since the last regular meeting of Council, and on upcoming events and activities.

Delegations

Roger Cook, Manager, Saugeen Mobility and Regional Transit

Roger Cook, Manager, Saugeen Mobility and Regional Transit, provided Council with updated ridership statistics and budget information. Saugeen Mobility and Regional Transit is our local specialized public transit partnership serving the mentally and physically challenged residents of participating municipalities, including Arran-Elderslie, Brockton, Chatsworth, Hanover, Huron-Kinloss, Kincardine, Saugeen Shores, Southgate, and West Grey.

Ridership in 2015 totaled 33941 up 12.06% from 30287 in 2014. User fees in 2015 totaled \$369,385.85 up 43.6% from \$257,261.39 in 2014, largely due to the individual user fee increase which took effect on January 1, 2015. Overall operating expenses were \$1,259,675 in 2015 compared to \$1,193,727 in 2014 with a 2015 net operating deficit of \$330,089 compared to \$513,987 the year before.

West Grey currently has 225 registered clients. Municipal contributions are calculated annually with a 30% weighting applied to population and a 70% weighting applied to ridership. West Grey's 2016 contribution share was \$83,158.08, amounting to 1.1% of local taxation.

Council asked why SMART is not participating in the County-wide transportation services initiative. Mr. Cook indicated SMART was not supportive as it would vastly increase the costs to SMART member municipalities.

Council asked about the proposed change in calculating municipalities share of costs to be partially based on a per kilometer charge. Mr. Cook indicated the Town of Hanover has requested this change as rides in Hanover are of a shorter distance than rides in rural municipalities. Council was advised if this change was incorporated,

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West Grey's share of costs in 2016 would have increased from approximately \$83,000 to \$94,000. Council questioned the merits of introducing a per kilometer charge.

Council asked of the 22 similar transportation service providers, how many cover the same extent of geographic area. Mr. Cook responded that very few, if any, of the comparable transportation service providers have such a large geographic area as is covered by SMART.

Robert Hitchcock, Manager of Business Development, Abundant Solar Energy Inc.

Robert Hitchcock, Manager of Business Development, Abundant Solar Energy Inc., provided draft municipal solar ground mount and solar rooftop lease agreements for between West Grey and Abundant Solar Energy for consideration by Council. The proposed West Grey ground mount and rooftop projects would involve 6 municipal sites, and Abundant Energy would pay a total lease rent for a 20 year period of \$1,032,000.00.

Mr. Hitchcock indicated Abundant Energy contacted the roof installer at the respective arenas, and are confident that the proposed roof top solar projects will not adversely impact the roofs. Engineering work on these roofs would be conducted if approval is obtained for these projects.

Mr. Hitchcock noted if direction to proceed is given by Council, a review of the proposed lease agreements should be completed by the municipal solicitor, and Abundant Energy would provide referrals for similar projects conducted by their firm.

Council posed a question regarding insurance coverage, and asked if West Grey will be named as an additional insured. Mr. Hitchcock indicated Abundant Energy has insurance, including liability insurance, and if something adverse happened, then a claim would be submitted by West Grey. Council also noted a potential concern regarding the proposed lease-hold mortgage provision, similar to the clause contained in the industrial wind turbine agreements.

Mr. Hitchcock indicated the lease is registered on title, and the mortgage is on the installation, and not the property. Mr. Hitchcock reiterated that the municipal solicitor should review the proposed leases.

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Council asked how the panels are attached to the arena roofs. Mr. Hitchcock explained how the panels are installed, not by bolts, but by dead weight and ballasts.

Council asked about the proposed installation of panels at landfill sites. Mr. Hitchcock indicated the solar panels would be placed on undisturbed areas at the landfill sites.

Mr. Hitchcock indicated Abundant Energy would require resolutions to be passed by Council. The deadline for submission is November 1, and it takes 4-6 weeks to prepare the applications.

Council requested the municipal solicitor (Ed Veldboom, of Russell Christie) to review the proposed ground mount and roof top solar lease agreements, and bring back comments and recommendations in time for discussion purposes during the September 19, 2016 Council meeting. – resolution #313-16 (Council specifically requested staff to inform Mr. Veldboom to comment on section 10 of the proposed lease agreement relating to leasehold/mortgage provisions; insurance coverage issues; and units not being bolted on roofs, with potential liability as a result.)

2017 Connecting link Application - Garafraxa Bridge - WSP Engineering Consultants has provided an estimated cost for repairs at approximately \$390,000. The proposed work includes: Milling off 50mm of concrete; deck delamination repair around cracks; joint repair; soffit repair; application of Fast Crete for patches; erosion control at Storm outlet; railing post replacement and railing rehabilitation; sidewalk and curb repairs; removal and relocation of the sanitary manhole clear of approach slab; and water proof and application of hot mix. 2016 AMO Conference - The 2016 AMO conference was held in Windsor this August. The conference was well attended with many informative sessions and great networking opportunities. (received for information)

Safety Concern with Stairs Leading to Wading Pool - Council requested a report with options on mitigating any potential safety concerns with the stair access to the wading pool from the August Committee of the Whole session. (Council agreed to consider this item as part of 2017 budget deliberations)

Lights and Controller at Tennis Courts - Staff has provided me with a quote to fix the light control panel and add a timer for the courts. The quote is from a local contractor and is for \$1,762.00 plus tax. Replacing the eight lights at the court and going to an LED system would be \$13,105.00 plus tax from a local contractor. Second quote came in at \$19,105.00 plus taxes. (Council agreed to consider these items for 2017 budget deliberations)

Finishing Touches to the Basketball Court - Council has requested potential costs to finalize the area surrounding the new basketball court. (Council agreed to consider these items as part of 2017 budget deliberations)
